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# TRUSTEES' REPORT AND ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2025

Penicuik Athletic Youth Football Club ('the club') is a charitable unincorporated association. Our purposes, as recorded in our constitution, are to provide a positive environment for young people to learn and participate in football and to be a positive advocate in our community.

#### **Activities**

Our player members are again on the increase, mainly with our younger age groups and with the lighter nights it is great to see all the players out training on all facilities throughout Penicuik. Some of our senior players continue along the pathway to play for Penicuik's U20's. Good luck to them all for the future.

Thank you to all coaches and members for their continued support, effort and for investing in our club and our children. The club is thriving with some amazing results across the board and we continue to promote sport in our local community.

#### Financial Review

The Club made a general fund surplus of £7,635. This was lower than last year, however the Club also made a surplus of £12,287 on restricted funds thanks to fundraising initiatives earmarked for future projects (2024 - overall surplus £14,549). Our overall total of incoming resources from charitable activities is up, mainly due to an increase in subscription income and fundraising events. Our costs have also risen as we continue to invest in equipment and kits for our teams and also in club development as we have welcomed an increasing number of volunteers to the Club, many of whom have been busy attending coaching and first aid courses to ensure all our players are able to continue to be involved in football activities.

During the year we have established new fundraising events with our Speakers night and Golf Day both being a success. We look forward to repeating both of these events and hosting other events during the next financial next year as we celebrate the Club's 70th anniversary.

Throughout the year we have also invested in improving our Clubhouse with the completion of our Pothole cafe which now provides extra revenue through the regular sale of refreshments and also our Reboot room which is free to all and is well stocked with good quality second hand boots and sports kit. Thanks to all the businesses and tradesmen who have kindly donated materials and their time in completing this.

Also during the year, the Club was proud to establish our Team United - Autism and Neurodiversity sessions ensuring that all members of our local community have access to football. We were successful in obtaining a grant from Foundation Scotland to support this team.

The financial stability of the Club continues to be strong which will enable us to continue running the club as normal. Finances will continue to be managed carefully, and the Committee are currently looking at ways to make this more efficient. We continue to look out for both sponsorship and grant funding opportunities and have once again applied to be part of the Tesco Blue token awards. We would also like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank all of our kit sponsors, whose continued support enables us to cover most of the costs of purchasing kits for our teams.

We also continue to ask subscription payers to support the club through the gift aid scheme to provide additional funds to support other initiatives which will benefit our players.

The Trustees of the Club are appointed by members at our Annual General Meeting.
